Treasurer Report

Mike Chirillo IMPBA Treasurer



Hey Folks! About this time, I like to do a profit/loss comparison of the fiscal year. (ends Oct. 31, 2021). Figures are through the month of June. Total income in 2021 is \$38,239, which is an increase over the same period last year, but a decrease from 2019 which gives us a better measure since the pandemic had a big impact on us. Most of this income loss is attributed to Senior membership dues. In 2020, we took in nearly \$6,000 less in membership dues compared to 2019, and it looks like in 2021 we recovered only about 1/3 of the loss — still below 2019 figures.

Expenses or liabilities for this FY period are \$26,362 (a decrease of nearly \$10,000 compared to last year). The driving factor is the new insurance program which allows us to pay a much smaller premium up front, and retain the remaining premium funds in our account to be paid only in event of a claim — so do your part to stay and play safe! The office upgrades were \$1,380. Printing costs are higher than 2020, but lower than 2019

Net income through June was \$11,880.51 (Compared to a *negative* \$84 for same period in 2020, and \$3,648 in 2019). We still have four months of expenses to go.

Total assets as of June: \$62,752.33.

In summary, the reduction in membership is a major concern for the hobby, as well as financially. The reduction in insurance costs have provided much needed relief to offset the negative effects of the pandemic. As long as insurance costs do not change dramatically, I am confident we should be able to maintain, if not increase, our total asset balance. •

TRIAL RULE FOR 2021 SEASON

The 1-Year Trial Rule for a new LSG Super Boat Offshore class has been in effect for this season. Members will have the opportunity to vote on whether to make it a permanent part of our rules in December 2021.

NOTE: The FE Scale Motor List is not a Trial Rule. It is an appeal to members and clubs to allow these motors in order to gain feedback on their performance in comparison to the currently approved motors. It remains in effect.

OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL STRUCTURE

The IMPBA organization is a 501(c)(4) non-profit corporation. Sources of income include: Memberships, Club Sanction Fees, Race & Record Trial Sanction Fees, and Newsletter Sponsor Fees. Other fees include printed Rule Book and printed Newsletter, however, costs for these items may exceed fees charged. Donations to the organization are accepted, but are not tax deductible as IMPBA is not a charitable organization. The Secretary & Treasurer ensure compliance with all Federal, State and Local laws regarding non-profit corporations as they relate to Indiana (original state of incorporation) and Ohio (physical office location). Year-end 990 Federal Informational Return is prepared by Vowells & Schaaf, LLP, CPAs. Compliance with By-Laws & Constitution of the IMPBA are ensured through a two-signature account. No two persons domiciled together may sign for any funds. Three officers hold signature rights on the bank accounts: Treasurer, Secretary & President.

The organization holds: a Savings Account which serves as an escrow for insurance purposes and maintains a minimum of \$15,000; a Regular Checking Account for normal business operations; and a PayPal Sub-Account for the sole purpose of being used for transfer of funds from the PayPal payment system balance. This was instituted as a stop-gap measure in the event of data compromise of the payment system. Fund transfers are routinely done. The bank accounts are currently no fee (with exception for non-sufficient fund, returned items, or foreign conversion.) PayPal charges processing fees based on a percentage of transaction and a flat amount per transaction.

Petty cash will be paid by MasterCard and a detailed report is received by Treasurer monthly. No cash fund is kept at the office. All expenses require a valid receipt be on record.

MEET IMPBA PRESIDENT NOMINEE Fred Lumb, Jr.



My name is **Fred Lumb, Jr.** I am running for the position of IMPBA President. I have been the District 12 director for two years, and have many years of experience as a model boat racer. I have a tremendous desire to bring back the excitement and member participation in IMPBA.

I live on a small farm in Bedford County, Virginia with my wife, Kelly, teenage son, Nicholas, and 4 dogs who needed a home. I am a veteran of the Navy, and spent most of my time in helicopter special warfare flying around Navy Seals. Most recently, I served as a Police Officer with the Roanoke County Police Department for 21 years, retiring in the spring of 2020.

Before I get into some of my goals and ideas, I would like to thank Matt Schofield for serving as IMPBA President. If you don't know Matt, you might not know he has three young kids— he's way busier than some of us old retired guys. I felt like someone with more free time should be willing to step up to do their part. I spoke to him the other night, and confirmed he wasn't going to run for a second term before I sought the nomination.

I was out of model boating for a few years and returned in 2018. Upon my return, I saw the amount of competition and races were down. We have competitive racers, but rarely do we have 20 boats or more entered in a class. I was very disappointed when I found that the Internats were no longer run each year. Our membership has changed over the years and the Internat format doesn't seem to be as popular anymore. I would like to see the US-1 champion brought back. I don't see a way of making the

original format feasible today. We should begin to look for another way to crown a champion with more than just heat racing. That new way shouldn't require two or three days of watching boats do time trials — way too much time, work and expense. The US-1 competition has always been what sets us apart from our friends in NAMBA.

Another goal as President will be to explore ways to attract new, younger members. Take a look around at your next race, and you'll see IMPBA is aging. We have to make some changes for IMPBA to continue and flourish. No one likes change, including myself, but if we don't attract younger members soon, we'll be in trouble. We need young folks who can put on races and have the physical ability to get in and out of a retrieve boat. How many of you reading this can do their own retrieves, or CD a large national event? See what I mean? If we don't work on this issue now, the only way we'll be able to race is by hiring people to run a race. Can you imagine the cost of entries if that happens?

I will work to address member concerns. I am available to discuss your ideas, and to assist you in presenting your solutions to keep model boating a fun, safe, and enjoyable hobby for all -- whether you are a racer, or just someone who likes to have fun running at your local practice pond.

If you disagree with what you've read, you don't have to be worried if I'm elected. Anything I propose will still have to be approved by the board, and I welcome opposing viewpoints and will always be available to talk boat racing and about what's good for the organization.



LSG SUPER BOAT OFFSHORE CLASS

SEC. I - Large Scale Gas / Article V- Specialty Classes.

Propose to insert language as item E. (following item D. Open LSG Offshore) Existing section designations would become item F through J). In addition, if adopted as a rule in December, Article VII- LSG International Regatta would need updated. (Refer to page I-6 in IMPBA Rule Book)

SECTION I LARGE SCALE GAS

V - SPECIALTY CLASSES

E. LSG Super Boat Offshore

1. Purpose

To provide a separate LSG Offshore class for the larger Super Boats. Class simulates realistic racing per the full-size American Power Boat Association (A.P.B.A.) Offshore Racing class. This class to follow all current IMPBA Open LSG Offshore rules, with exceptions as noted below.

2. Hull Specifications

- a. IMPBA Mono and Catamaran hulls per "Technical Standards", Hull Classifications.
- b. Class MINIMUM hull length: 55 inches.
- c. In Super Boat Offshore class, the cowling/hatches must cover the full deck opening.

3. Engine Specifications

- a. Any IMPBA legal LSG Engine.
- b. Tuned exhaust must be enclosed under the deck/cowling/hatch with pipes exiting through the stern.

4. Racing Rules

Super Boat class will utilize Offshore Course A or Offshore Course B only-there will be no left turns on the course.

ick Tyndall of Mechanicsville, Virginia, was inducted into the Hall of Fame for 2021. He joined IMPBA in 1984 and has been a member for more than 30 years. He began racing with his father, James Tyndall.

Dick served two terms as the District 12 Director in the early 90s, and then followed that with two terms as IMPBA President (1995-96 & 1997-98). His late wife, Priscilla, served as IMPBA Secretary during this time, and his son, John, was also a member. As Director, he proposed our current noise level rule, and continued to be a driving force behind its implementation throughout his presidency and then while in the position of Vice-President. As this was a major change to model boating, it was met with fierce resistance. He persevered for years, eventually convincing the organization to adopt the rule —which has undoubtably saved countless model boating ponds.

Dick is currently the President of the Richmond Area Model Boat Organization (RAMBO). He has served in this capacity many times, and was indispensable in working with the Richmond City officials to host races at the city park. The club donated registration money to a local adult daycare to show their appreciation for the city's cooperation.

Being a machinist, Dick decided to make his own hardware, and began making items for his fellow model boaters under the name of Virginia Craftsman. He became well-known for his quality, and his turn-fins have become legendary in model boating. His introduction of surface-drive hardware for mono hulls helped advance that technology. He is an accomplished Nitro engine tuner and racer, and has won many National titles, six US-1 awards from 1992-2012, and the President's Cup in 1998.

Dick's contributions to model boating are numerous, and while he is best known for his willingness to help other boaters improve their setups and driving skills, and become better racers, it is his dedication to the IMPBA organization that has always been most obvious to those who know him best. He has been instrumental in securing new race sites, and has served as Contest Director at countless events.

Dick Tyndall's enthusiasm and dedication to the hobby and the organization, makes him an excellent addition to the IMPBA Hall of Fame.

Congratulations on this well-deserved honor.◆

You asked for it. We made it. We now have available a 4mm brass streamlined prop tail nut. It is similar to our OC6PNMM prop tail nut for the 10-32 thread on a 3/16" shaft, but this is designed for a 4mm threaded prop shaft. Shown below is our full range of prop tail nuts.



We now offer an X437/3R propeller. This prop is cast in beryllium copper and fits on a 3/16" shaft. This is ideal with the standard X437/3 when setting up smaller boats with counter rotating props. We also offer flex cable in standard left lay or right hand lay.

Speaking of cable, we now offer the .187 (3/16") left lay cable in a standard or our new stiffer version.

We have available three popular sizes of moly-nylon thrust washers in packages of 10. OC4TWM - fits 1/8" shaft with a 1/4" o.d. OC6TWMM - fits 3/16" shaft with a 5/16" o.d. OC8TWM - fits 1/4" shaft with a 7/16" o.d.

We have expanded our assortment of prop reducer bushing. The sizes available include - OC46RB - for installing 3/16" bore props on an 1/8" shaft.


OC58RB - for installing 1/4" bore props on a 5mm shaft

These reducers are ideal when fine tuning your propeller selection, especially if you are borderline between two different shaft sizes, or if you are trying to fit a prop on a metric shaft.










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National Records Director

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REMEMBER: SAFE BOATING IS NO ACCIDENT!

It's up to all of us to stay safe, so if you see something... say something!

GENERAL

All IMPBA members and /or contestants are responsible to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the concept of good sportsmanship: to wit, a person who plays fair and conducts him/herself in an acceptable fashion while participating in IMPBA events.

The use of alcohol or illegal substance and/or abuse of prescription drugs while participating in an IMPBA race or sanctioned event is considered unacceptable conduct and is a Code of Conduct violation.

IMPBA reserves the right to deny membership to any individual who has, at any time, demonstrated unsafe boating practices, been suspended, or banned from another boating organization for any amount of time, or for any reason.

Adequate provisions shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.

Club Safety Officers should inspect the pond area prior to Open Water, or start of events to ensure IMPBA rules are in effect and adequate protections are in place. A first-aid kit should be maintained by the officer.

Boats not considered safe may be denied running privileges. Additionally, boats that show erratic behavior indicating possible control problems may be ordered off the course and given points for "Did Not Finish." The driver must demonstrate the problem has been repaired before he/she may continue in the next heat.

Frequency flags/tags and impound procedures will be used on transmitters. A radio may only be turned on when the correct frequency flag/tag is available.

2.4 Ghz frequency transmitters are exempt from these rules.

SITE SAFETY

"NO SWIMMING" signs MUST be posted on all sides of pond.

No person shall be permitted in the water without express permission of the Contest Director.

No model boats may run while the retrieve boat is working or any full-size boat is in operation.

Persons under 16 must wear U.S.C.G. approved personal flotation device while operating the retrieve boat. PFD should be available for each person in the boat.

Safety Netting should be placed on all sides of the pond exposed directly to spectators and contestants. Any area not covered by netting MUST be kept free of all people and animals during the event using signs, ropes, or barriers.

Caution tape, signs, barriers, fencing and/or netting shall be used to keep spectators out of the water and a minimum of 25 feet from the shoreline, and signs posted: "No Spectators Beyond This Point"

Race officials, contestants, and assistants (PAID IMPBA only) are the only persons allowed in the restricted pit/engine test area (Neon safety wristbands should be issued to all to easily identify).

An effort should be made to protect boaters in the pit area by using netting, or a raised launch area.

Tent & canopy, or similar, must have in-ground anchor.

Fire extinguishers MUST be in the pit/engine test area.

No smoking in pit/engine test area.

Host club should provide depository for disposal of racers' contaminated fuel

Drivers stands/steps should have reasonably slip-resistant surface and hand-rails on all sides.

SAFE OPERATION

Whenever running a boat, whether during a race or practicing, there must be a spotter for each driver to watch for unsafe conditions.

When in the pit/engine test/launch areas shoes MUST be worn. Sandals or open-toe shoes are NOT acceptable.

If your club doesn't have a copy of the form, just email the office until the forms page is set up on the website. The way it is set up, is that for a dollar, ANYONE that shows an interest in what we are doing, and may be spectating on a test day, or at a club fun run, may sign up as a Guest, be insured under the tutelage of an IMPBA member, and run a boat with an IMPBA member acting as a spotter. The way our club utilizes it is like this: Say a person is hanging around (newbie or a former racer), and they show an interest. Sign 'em up, and show them how to run a boat, letting them have real world experience on the driver's stand! Most of our members have no issues letting that person run one of their boats (being guided and helping with the transmitter as needed). This has been one of our number one tools that helps bring in new members to our club, and IMPBA. It is a fantastic option to "dip a toe" into R/C boating, without the expense of signing on for a year's membership! (NOTE: This is not valid for any racing.)

Other avenues of promotion are publicity, utilizing what's around you like local news, and your County or Parish government— let them know what we do! With that being said, another venue or avenue is social media (Ughhh! What a double edged sword that can be, right?) Pros of social media



Summary

IMPBA membership dues include commercial general liability and property damage insurance which protects individual members, registered clubs, municipal & state park boards, and private landowners from suits by third parties who may be injured by model power boats that are operated on IMPBA insured bodies of water for which member

clubs have submitted the correct application (on a Club Registration and Insurance Application form), and have been issued an insurance certificate. Since rates or coverages may vary from time to time, up to date insurance information may be obtained from the IMPBA office.

Membership Coverage

All members in good standing will be covered at "sponsored, scheduled, and supervised activities." This means the coverage is good at sanctioned and club races, and open water practice sessions as long as you are following the safety procedures outlined through the IMPBA, and such events take place on an IMPBA insured body of water only. IMPBA's policy is considered a primary policy and would cover the

costs of property damages or injuries to third parties caused by IMPBA event participants that may occur on an IMPBA insured body of water. It would also cover the cost of your legal defense and settlement or award should you be successfully sued - up to the policy limits. A deductible applies per claim. For current coverage and deductible information contact the IMPBA office.

Non-Member Coverage

The insurance does not cover any person who is not a paid member of IMPBA regardless of what other club or organization he may belong to. Paid members of other boating organizations may pay a single-event fee of \$15 for membership dues **during that event only.** The single-event application and payment must be completed online and can be found at www.IMPBA.net.

Therefore, no person may operate or assist in the operation of a model power boat, or enter the pit area, or operate a retrieve boat at any IMPBA sanctioned event on an IMPBA insured pond, and be covered by this insurance, unless he is a paid member of IMPBA.

Insured Sites

- No club may apply for insurance for a body of water presently or previously insured by another IMPBA Registered Club without the permission of that club.
- All Clubs applying for insurance on a body of water should submit a club application and a signed letter
 from the pond owner, on letterhead, giving their authorization for your particular club to conduct Model
 R/C Boat activities at that particular site.
- Permanent and temporary structures, such as drivers' stands/scaffolding or bleachers, are not covered by IMPBA insurance.

Safety

- It is not the intent of IMPBA to issue insurance to any organization that does not comply with and foster IMPBA Safety Rules and Regulations
- Adequate provision shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.
- "NO SWIMMING" signs should be posted in conspicuous places on all sides of the pond.


