OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL STRUCTURE

The IMPBA organization is a 501(c)(4) non-profit corporation. Sources of income include: Memberships, Club Sanction Fees, Race & Record Trial Sanction Fees, and Newsletter Sponsor Fees. Other fees include printed Rule Book and printed Newsletter, however, costs for these items may exceed fees charged. Donations to the organization are accepted, but are not tax deductible as IMPBA is not a charitable organization. The Secretary & Treasurer ensure compliance with all Federal, State and Local laws regarding non-profit corporations. Year-end 990 Federal Informational Return is prepared by Vowells & Schaaf, LLP, CPAs. Compliance with By-Laws & Constitution of the IMPBA are ensured in that no two persons domiciled together may sign for any funds. Three officers hold signature rights on the bank accounts. The organization holds a Savings Account and Checking Accounts for normal business operations, and uses PayPal for processing of memberships and fees other than those received by check or money order. Fund transfers are routinely done. The bank accounts are currently no fee (with exception for non-sufficient fund, returned items, or foreign conversion). Transaction processing fees are based on a percentage of transaction plus a flat rate amount per transaction.

Petty cash will be paid by MasterCard and a detailed report is received by Treasurer monthly. No cash fund is kept at the office. All expenses require a valid receipt be on file.

Supporting THE HOBBY

It has been my good fortune to have run model boats for more than 50 years. Over that time, I was able to race in twelve different countries on three different continents.

After all these years running model boats, I know that I am not a great driver. I am not a great modeler, or an engine guru — **but**, I have become expert in having a good time. I can't think of anything I'd rather do than run my model boats.

What I've found over the years, is that model boaters are pretty much the same around the world. They like the camaraderie. They like the challenge of making a model boat perform. They like the competition.

In almost every instance, I've seen nothing but fair competition, respect for each other, and respect for the people hosting the event. But, that is not *always* the case.

While 98% of the people competing want to follow the rules, win fairly, and take pride in their actions, there seems to be a few that make winning at all costs all that matters. Some are mostly concerned with making money off the hobby. Some are mostly concerned with getting personal recognition.

We've been there when somebody goes off on a CD call or on a judge. The result is that fewer people are willing to help on the judge's stand. We've been there when one boater goes off on another over a racing incident. The result is that someone stops going to races. We've been there when someone has been caught cheating.

In 2006, I was at the World Championships in Norway. There was a discrepancy over the frequency two boaters were using. The rule there was that if two boaters in the hot pits were on the same frequency, neither could run in that heat. One boater took offence and flipped off the CD – not only was he DQ'd from that heat—he was DQ'd for the rest of the 2 week long event. I asked the CD if he thought the punishment was too severe. He told me that model boating is a gentlemen's sport. If you weren't a gentleman, you should not be allowed to compete.

That comment has stuck with me these past 17 years.

If we are to support our hobby, if we are to keep model boating fun for everyone, if we are to help it grow, we need to look in the mirror. The simple behavior of respect for others is all it takes.

If you do not win a race, you did not lose your home, your vehicle, or even your dinner. If your boat is dead in the water and gets run over—that happens—it is part of racing. If you hit a dead boat, remember that it happens to everyone at one time or another. It is racing. I know my boats have been hit, and I have hit others. While I feel bad about it, we have to accept that chance if we want to race.

If we are called for a jump start, we have to accept that was the call. It does not help to question the judge's intelligence. I know of instances where one boater actually stabbed another over a racing incident. I know of instances where one boater was threatened with a weapon over a racing incident. I've been challenged to a fist fight because one boater did not like being called for a buoy infraction. For our hobby to survive and grow, we need to treat each other like the friends we are. If you cannot do that, you are hurting the hobby and everyone that enjoys it.

So take that look in the mirror and honestly ask yourself, are you the boater who makes others uncomfortable, or the one who makes the day enjoyable for everyone? ◆

If we are to support our hobby, and if we are to keep model boating fun for everyone, we need to practice simple respect for others.

A Hydro & B Hydro as separate US-1 Classes #23-004

<u>Purpose:</u> To separate the .12 Hydro (A) from the .21 Hydro (B) in US-1 competition. In previous years there were a significant number of Nitro entries, and A/B and C/D were combined to save time. Today with the speed and size of the .21 riggers, a .12 is not competitive when they are run together in a heat.

XI - NITRO INTERNATIONAL REGATTA

A. US-1 Eligible Classes

The following 16 classes may enter the 1/16 mile SAW, 1/3 mile Oval, and multi-boat heat racing events at a US-1 format Nitro International Regatta to be eligible for the US-1 International Champion and Excellence of Performance Trophies per Section E-Procedures.

1. A, B, CD, E, F Hydro; AB, CD, E, F Mono; B, D, E, F Outboard Tunnel; 1/8 Scale Hydro; Sport 40; Multi-Engine Hydro.

Approved Feb. 15, 2022 Board Meeting.

The following CONSTITUTION SECTION Proposal will go before the membership for vote in December.

A majority of the Board of Directors is recommending passage of this proposal.

If passed, this rule change will become an official part of the Rule Book beginning with the 2024 season.

AMENDMENTS PROCESS

PURPOSE:

The Board currently has the authority to make "clarifications not changing the intent of a rule" that are in the best interest of both the organization and membership. This proposed change would clearly state that "technical corrections" also fall into this category and may be handled directly by the BOD. It is prohibitive to have to wait a full season for a membership vote to correct what is often an error, or poor wording in the original rule.

The BOD recommends membership approve this amendment to the Constitution so that it is clear in the future that these types of rule book updates may be made during the season with BOD approval. - B. All rule proposals regarding the Constitution, By-Laws, Procedures, General Rules of Competition, Contest & Racing Rules, Technical Standards, and those pertaining to Classes (except those that affect safety or financial solvency of the organization, or clarifications not changing the intent of a rule), will be reviewed during any regular or special meeting of the Executive Board. The board will evaluate and approve or disapprove or amend all proposals. (Guideline: Does it benefit the IMPBA, and does it benefit the membership? It must benefit both)

It is proposed to change B. to read:

 B. All rule proposals will be reviewed during any regular or special meeting of the Executive Board. The board will evaluate and approve, disapprove or amend all proposals. Proposed amendments that affect safety, financial solvency of the organization, or clarifications and technical corrections not changing the intent of a rule, may be reviewed and immediately implemented by the board. (Guideline: Does it benefit the IMPBA, and does it benefit the membership? It must benefit both)

CONSTITUTION: Past President / Vice President / Nominations

PURPOSE:

To address how Vice President is appointed, Past President status, defines terms and election eligibility of interim Presidents, and future eligibility of those who resign or are removed from offices.

Relevant Sections:

(Sec. B- Constitution, pages B-2, B-3, B-4.) The following sections have proposed changes. It is proposed to delete any language shown struckthrough, and insert the highlighted language.

SEC. B - CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS & EXECUTIVE BOARD SECTION 1

The Executive Board shall be made up of the President, District Directors, National Fast Electric Director, National Large Scale Gasoline Director, National Nitro Director, and Past Presidents effective with the President in office as of January 1, 1974.

- A. The office of President shall be limited to two (2) terms for any one person.
 - 1. A person serving in an elected director position who fills a presidential vacancy per the Bylaws is considered to have served a full term if more than one-half of the term left vacant is served. This interim President is eligible for Past President appointment and life member status, and may then only run for a second term.
 - a. An interim President who serves less than one-half of the term left vacant, shall not be eligible for Past President status or life membership, and may run for two elected terms.
- B. Each member of the Executive Board shall have equal voting rights provided requirements of Constitution, Article V, Section 3, and Paragraph D are complying.
- C Appointments of Past Presidents to the Executive Board shall be for life with voting rights limitedto the one or two following terms of office.
 - 1. Past President who served as President for one term votes for 3 years, a Past President whoserved for two terms votes for 6 years.
- C Appointments of Past Presidents to the Executive Board are offered for life with voting rights limited to the three (3) years sequentially following their full term as President. Any Past President can terminate their Executive Board participation upon notice of such intent with no pathway of return to the Board as Past President.
 - 1. A President who resigns or is removed from office is not eligible for Past President appointment or life membership status no matter the length of his service.

SEC. B - CONSTITUTION ARTICLE VI - NOMINATIONS SECTION 1

Nominations of any elected officer shall be accompanied by a petition signed by five (5) members in good standing and a declaration of acceptance by the nominee. Write-in votes will not be allowed unless there are no official nominees received by the IMPBA Office. If write-in votes are to be used they will be counted and totaled in the same manner as for an official nominee provided the write-in candidate meets the eligibility requirements for the President. See Article V, Section 3-A of the Constitution. A nomination for any position of a member who has previously resigned or been removed from any position, must be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of the entire Board of Directors in order to be placed on the ballot for said position.

The secretary shall receive nominations for all elected officers no later than July 31 each year.

FE Scale Rules Revise

PURPOSE:

To remove the items regarding Scale Unlimited that are common to all 1/8 Scale, and instead reference Sec. H -Nitro Specialized Classes, Article II, in order to have the main rules listed in one place.

For the purposes of FE power rules, the proposal will eliminate the motor list defining specific manufacturers and motor models or series. Motor list is replaced with "not to exceed" motor definitions defining outside diameter limit and overall motor length. This should increase the commercially available motor options.

Sec.J - FAST ELECTRIC

E.S cale FE Unlimited Hydro

1. General

FE Scale Unlimited Hydro shall comply with the rules listed in area II - Scale Unlimited Rules, (A thru G) of IMPBA Section H - Nitro Special Classes. The following exceptions listed in this section will replace and/or take precedence for FE Scale Unlimited Hydro competition.

2. Power and Boat Specifications

- a. The motor, controller, and batteries (power system) shall be concealed with a fake engine or cowling as per the prototype.
- b. Motor must be an inrunner type. Outrunners are prohibited.
- c. Battery voltage shall span the S/T voltage specification.
- d. Only one motor shall be used. Multiple motors are prohibited.
- e. Motor outside diameter shall not exceed 41.00mm. Measurement shall be taken without the cooling ring assembled or in an area the motor outside diameter is exposed.
- f. Motor length shall not exceed 108.00mm. Measurement shall be taken from the forwardfacing mounting surface to the furthest point of the motor end bell. Motor leads and rotor shaft protrusions shall not be included.







Summary

IMPBA membership dues include commercial general liability and property damage insurance which protects individual members, registered clubs, municipal & state park boards, and private landowners from suits by third parties who may be injured by model power boats that are operated on IMPBA insured bodies of water for which member clubs have submitted the correct application (on a Club Registration and Insurance Application form), and have been issued an insurance certificate. Since rates or coverages may vary from time to time, up to date insurance information may be obtained from the IMPBA office.

Membership Coverage

All members in good standing will be covered at "sponsored, scheduled, and supervised activities." This means the coverage is good at sanctioned and club races, and open water practice sessions as long as you are following the safety procedures outlined through the IMPBA, and such events take place on an IMPBA insured body of water only. IMPBA's policy is considered a primary policy and would cover the costs of property damages or injuries to third parties caused by IMPBA event participants that may occur on an IMPBA insured body of water. It would also cover the cost of your legal defense and settlement or award should you be successfully sued - up to the policy limits. A deductible applies per claim. For current coverage and deductible information contact the IMPBA office.

Non-Member Coverage

The insurance does not cover any person who is not a paid member of IMPBA regardless of what other club or organization he may belong to. Paid members of other boating organizations may pay a single-event fee of \$15 for membership dues **during that event only.** The single-event application and payment must be completed online and can be found at www.IMPBA.net.

Therefore, no person may operate or assist in the operation of a model power boat, or enter the pit area, or operate a retrieve boat at any IMPBA sanctioned event on an IMPBA insured pond, and be covered by this insurance, unless he is a paid member of IMPBA.

Insured Sites


- No club may apply for insurance for a body of water presently or previously insured by another IMPBA Registered Club without the permission of that club.
- All Clubs applying for insurance on a body of water should submit a club application and a signed letter from the pond owner, on letterhead, giving their authorization for your particular club to conduct Model R/C Boat activities at that particular site.
- Permanent and temporary structures, such as drivers' stands/scaffolding or bleachers, are not covered by IMPBA insurance.

Safety

- It is not the intent of IMPBA to issue insurance to any organization that does not comply with and foster IMPBA Safety Rules and Regulations
- Adequate provision shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.
- "NO SWIMMING" signs should be posted in conspicuous places on all sides of the pond.

REMEMBER: SAFE BOATING IS NO ACCIDENT!



REMEMBER: SAFE BOATING IS NO ACCIDENT!

It's up to all of us to stay safe, so if you see something... say something!

GENERAL

All IMPBA members and /or contestants are responsible to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the concept of good sportsmanship: to wit, a person who plays fair and conducts him/herself in an acceptable fashion while participating in IMPBA events.

The use of alcohol or illegal substance and/or abuse of prescription drugs while participating in an IMPBA race or sanctioned event is considered unacceptable conduct and is a Code of Conduct violation.

IMPBA reserves the right to deny membership to any individual who has, at any time, demonstrated unsafe boating practices, been suspended, or banned from another boating organization for any amount of time, or for any reason.

Adequate provisions shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.

Club Safety Officers should inspect the pond area prior to Open Water, or start of events to ensure IMPBA rules are in effect and adequate protections are in place. A first-aid kit should be maintained by the officer.

Boats not considered safe may be denied running privileges. Additionally, boats that show erratic behavior indicating possible control problems may be ordered off the course and given points for "Did Not Finish." The driver must demonstrate the problem has been repaired before he/she may continue in the next heat.

Frequency flags/tags and impound procedures will be used on transmitters. A radio may only be turned on when the correct frequency flag/tag is available. 2.4 Ghz frequency transmitters are exempt from these rules.

SITE SAFETY

"NO SWIMMING" signs MUST be posted on all sides of pond.

No person shall be permitted in the water without express permission of the Contest Director.

No model boats may run while the retrieve boat is working or any full-size boat is in operation.

Persons under 16 must wear U.S.C.G. approved personal flotation device while operating the retrieve boat. PFD should be available for each person in the boat.

Safety Netting should be placed on all sides of the pond exposed directly to spectators and contestants. Any area not covered by netting MUST be kept free of all people and animals during the event using signs, ropes, or barriers.

Caution tape, signs, barriers, fencing and/or netting shall be used to keep spectators out of the water and a minimum of 25 feet from the shoreline, and signs posted: "No Spectators Beyond This Point"

Race officials, contestants, and assistants (PAID IMPBA only) are the only persons allowed in the restricted pit/engine test area (Neon safety wristbands should be issued to all to easily identify).

An effort should be made to protect boaters in the pit area by using netting, or a raised launch area.

Tent & canopy, or similar, must have in-ground anchor.

Fire extinguishers MUST be in the pit/engine test area.

No smoking in pit/engine test area.

Host club should provide depository for disposal of racers' contaminated fuel

Drivers stands/steps should have reasonably slip-resistant surface and hand-rails on all sides.

SAFE OPERATION

Whenever running a boat, whether during a race or practicing, there must be a spotter for each driver to watch for unsafe conditions.

When in the pit/engine test/launch areas shoes MUST be worn. Sandals or open-toe shoes are NOT acceptable.

Boaters should test their radio operation before starting an engine.

Always WALK TO THE LAUNCH SITE.

Once a boat passes the entrance buoy, there will be NO RE-LAUNCH.

Never bring a boat to the pit area straight in — ALWAYS RUN PARALLEL TO SHORE while slowing it down.

. When Is a Race Sanction Needed?

As a general guideline, your club should send in a sanction form for any event which you intend to advertise and invite persons outside of your club. This includes other IMPBA members and other recognized organization members such as NAMBA. This also allows you to accept the Single-Event Fee from a NAMBA member to enable him/her to race and be covered by IMPBA general liability insurance. Also any special exhibition races that you expect to be covered by IMPBA insurance need to be sanctioned as the site for the event must meet IMPBA safety criteria to be covered under our policy. A club race just for your club members does not require a sanction. Only sanctioned events & flyers will be listed on the IMPBA website Races/Events tab and Master Schedule.

What Does a Sanction Mean?

A Sanction is the official authorization of an event. A Sanction tells prospective participants that your club and pond are insured and they are therefore protected as IMPBA members, and that you agree to abide by all IMPBA Rules and Regulations. Contest Directors running the event and the CD/Referee making the calls must have successfully completed the CD test and carry the CD designation on their card. Deviations from competition rules are allowed as long as they are clearly stated on the entry form or site. It ensures participants that the rules will be impartially enforced, and guarantees the results of the event will be recognized as official.

Q. Who Approves a Sanction?

The Director for the district in which the contest is being held is responsible for approving sanction requests. This allows the Director to coordinate events within the district to avoid overlap that would affect attendance at your event or an event elsewhere in the district. When you submit your form directly to the IMPBA office, if it is not already signed, the office will contact your Director to verify the dates were approved. If there is a conflict, your director will contact you to work with your club on a solution or alternate date.

How Many Times Can a Single-Event Fee Be Paid By Non-IMPBA Members?

Multiple times. IMPBA allows persons who have a <u>paid membership to other boating</u> <u>organizations</u> to pay a fee so that they are included as a covered party under our General Liability insurance. They may pay this fee as many times per year as they wish. The \$15 fee allows running in <u>that event only</u>. The other organization member must pay a separate \$15 fee for each IMPBA sanctioned race he/she wishes to attend. The Single-Event status is not available in leu of a paid membership to a boating organization! To run on an IMPBA insured body of water you must be a paid IMPBA member, or a paid member of another organization who pays the Single-Event fee to run at an IMPBA sanctioned event. The Single-Event form and fee <u>MUST be completed online</u> (preferably at least on week prior to the event), clubs will not accept these fees at the race site.


