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Hello everyone! I hope this report finds you all doing well on this, our 75th Anniversary. We currently have 38 clubs at 46 pond locations. Welcome to our newest club — the Pond Pirates R/C Boat Club of Hamilton, AL in District 5.

We have 48 events sanctioned to date. These include the Gas Nationals in Sycamore, GA, the Nitro International Regatta in Huntsville, AL, and a couple of demonstration events by clubs. We expect some Record Trial additions in the fall.

Membership is 949 as of the end of July. 69 new members have joined this year, and 5 juniors have become seniors. This is on par with where we are normally. We finished 2023 with 1032 members. Late season membership will open the last week of August for those joining only for September through December.

OVERVIEW OF FINANCIAL STRUCTURE

The IMPBA organization is a 501(c)(4) non-profit corporation. Sources of income include: Memberships, Club Sanction Fees, Race & Record Trial Sanction Fees, and Newsletter Sponsor Fees. Other fees include printed Rule Book and printed Newsletter, however, costs for these items may exceed fees charged. Donations to the organization are accepted, but are not tax deductible as IMPBA is not a charitable organization. The Secretary & Treasurer ensure compliance with all Federal, State and Local laws regarding non-profit corporations. Year-end 990 Federal Informational Return is prepared by Vowells & Schaaf, LLP, CPAs. Compliance with By-Laws & Constitution of the IMPBA are ensured in that no two persons domiciled together may sign for any funds. Three officers hold signature rights on the bank accounts. The organization holds a Savings Account and Checking Accounts for normal business operations, and uses PayPal for processing of memberships and fees other than those received by check or money order. Fund transfers are routinely done. The bank accounts are currently no fee (with exception for non-sufficient fund, returned items, or foreign conversion). Transaction processing fees are based on a percentage of transaction plus a flat rate amount per transaction.

Petty cash will be paid by MasterCard and a detailed report is received by Treasurer monthly. No cash fund is kept at the office. All expenses require a valid receipt be on file.

TLSG64 Engine Rule Clarification

Section I- Large Scale Gas was updated to clarify the TLSG64 Engine Rules. Added "and Super Boat Offshore." to Article IV- Engine Classification / Rule C (3). Approved unanimously of votes cast for Immediate Implementation. 17 YES VOTES (D1=2; D3=2; D4=1; D5=2; D6=1; D7=0; D12=2; D13=1; D14=2; FE=1; LSG=1; Nitro=1; PP=1) 0 NO VOTES. 0 Abstains. Vote not cast by D2.

Board email vote July 3, 2024 - Updated and posted.

Request for Reimbursement of Travel Expenses for 2024 Nitro Internats

A one-time expense request was made to reimburse the President of IMPBA to travel to Huntsville for the Heat Racing portion of the Nitro US-1 Internats. Request was made by the host club to come meet and greet racers and hear their ideas and concerns. Per diem rates as stated on gsa.gov were used as a basis for lodging, meal allowance, and gas. Advance of \$1,000 approved. Actual amount paid will be based on receipts, and unused balance repaid to IMPBA. Approved by a majority of votes cast.

Annual Meeting July 23, 2024

4 Proposals Approved for Membership Vote in December

At the Annual Meeting the BOD approved several proposals for publication. They appear in this issue and will be ballot issues to be voted on by membership in December. Please review the proposals and call your District Director if you have any concerns. They were approved unanimously by all present and BOD recommends passage:

Heat Racing DQ Points Amendment Proposal #24-003

Proposed to update rule to more fairly assign points to a boat disabled by another racer who is DQ'd.

Scale Lost Part Penalty Amendment Proposal #24-004

Proposed to make lost part penalty 1-lap in all instances for all power sources, and eliminate the 6th place rule.

Scale Registration Process Proposal #24-005

Proposed to offer 2 options for registration: One-time or Annual. Each District Scale Director may decide which works best for their purposes and any fees needed. Eliminate the 1-yr. compete requirement.

Bylaws Club Responsibilities Proposal #24-006

Proposed to reorganize existing Chapter II-Membership Dues section. Individual info to be followed by club info. Add Additional site information. Add step process for clubs in violation of Safety rules to clearly state there will be suspension of activities & sanctions until corrective action is taken.

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





POINTS FOR RACER DISABLED DUE TO DQ

PURPOSE:

More fairly assign points when a boat is disabled due to an infraction of another racer who is then DQ'd..

Section G, Subsection II -Heat Racing, Rule E-1 (page G-5), and update of referenced Appendix A (page G-10). **Proposed language shown highlighted & red.** Omit language shown struckthough.

The following RULE CHANGE Proposal will go before the membership for vote in December. The Board of Directors is unanimously recommending passage of this proposal.

If passed, this rule change will become an official part of the Rule Book beginning with the 2025 season.

SCALE "LOST PART" RULE

PURPOSE:

Proposed to simplify the Scale Unlimited Hydroplane class "lost part rule" by making it a one-lap penalty under all circumstances, and eliminate the 6th place points rule. This will affect all power classes.

Relevant Sections:

Refer to 2024 IMPBA Rule Book pages noted below for <u>each</u> section affected by this proposal. (*Note: FE Scale now follows Nitro Specialized Scale racing rules.*) **Proposed changes shown in red and highlighted**, and omit the language shown struckthrough.

SECTION H - NITRO SPECIALIZED CLASSES (pages H-3 thru H-5)

II - SCALE UNLIMITED RULES

- F. Racing Rules
 - 11. If any removable parts (cowling(s), wing(s), dummy engine, driver, etc.) fall off during a heat, except as the result of a collision, that boat will receive a one-lap penalty. no more than sixth-place points for that heat. This penalization does not affect the finishing placement of the boat, only the points awarded. The points awarded and placements of the other boats in the heat are not affected by this ruling.



BYLAWS MEMBERSHIP AMENDMENT

PURPOSE:

Reorganization of the section for better flow of information: Individual membership info followed by Club membership info. Addition of separate club violation penalties language, and director actions, giving clubs an opportunity to correct issues before more severe penalty is imposed.

SECTION C - BYLAWS (page C-1 & C-2)

CHAPTER II - MEMBERSHIP DUES

- A. Individual Memberships All memberships expire December 31 of each year.
 - Dues will be \$50.00 per year for renewing Senior Membership prior to January 1. (See Membership Application). New members / Renewing members Jan. 1 and after - \$60.00 per year. All Late Season Senior Memberships after Sept. 1 will be \$30 for the remainder of the year.
 - 2. Family Rate: The Senior member's spouse, and his/her children under 18 residing at the same address may be added to the membership for \$10.00 each. First family member is designated as primary member.
 - 3. Junior Rates: \$10.00 per year for persons 18 and under who does not have the opportunity to join under the family rate plan.
 - 4. Members of the Executive Board shall not pay dues while in office. With the President receiving a life membership (subject to limitations of Sec. B-Constitution, Article V, Section 1).
 - 5. Paid members of other boating organizations may pay \$15.00 for a Single-Event membership, allowing running in that event only.
 - 6. Guest Limited Membership a nominal fee may be paid at a club pond or event which would allow the guest access to the driver's stand with an IMPBA spotter for the sole purpose of a brief trial demonstration using club/demonstration boats only. Confers limited temporary membership rights only no access to Hot Pit or Launch Area, **not valid for racing**, and guest must be at least 10 years old. Minors must have a parent signature to participate. Forms must be complete. Single use on that day only.

- B. Persons who knowingly run on an insured club pond without a current membership and contestants that knowingly attempt to enter run at an IMPBA event under false pretense and are later caught will also face the following penalties (club may also be subject to penalties under rule C(4) below):
 - 1. First infraction: Loss of IMPBA membership from the time of the offense for one (1) year. Also the loss of the "single-event" privilege if the member has a membership in another boating organization for the same time period, and no refund of membership monies.
 - 2. Second infraction: Loss of IMPBA membership from the time of the offense for three (3) years. Also the loss of the "single-event" privilege if the member has a membership in another boating organization for same time period, and no refund of membership monies.
- C. Club Membership Dues / Registration expire December 31 of each year.
 - Charge is \$50.00 per year. If paid for before January 1, dues will receive a \$10.00 discount to \$40.00. The above dues include IMPBA Commercial General Liability and Property Damage Insurance for one (1) pond location. Additional pond sites may be insured for a fee of \$10 for each location.
 - Clubs are responsible to insure all Safety rules are followed, valid insurance is in place, and adequate protections are in place at their sites (Section S - Safety, and Section E -Procedures).
 - 3. All IMPBA clubs are to ensure those boating on their insured ponds at club sponsored and sanctioned events are paid-up members of IMPBA, and that sanctioned event contestants/ participants who hold a current membership card with another boating organization have paid their Single-Event Fee. If membership cannot be verified, they must complete and sign an application and pay their IMPBA dues. Guest Limited forms must be completed and fees collected prior to demonstration. All membership applications (IMPBA, Single-Event, and Guest limited) and fees must be mailed to the IMPBA office by the host club the first working day after accepted.
 - 4. If clubs are caught violating this procedure violate the above procedures, then the following will apply: No matter the number of infractions at an event it will only be counted as one (1) violation. with the exception of safety rules.
 - First infraction: a written warning to the club A written plan for corrective action may be put in place. Club will be responsible to pay uncollected fees for any memberships they did not verify (the individual may also be subject to penalties under rule B of this section). District Director has authority (Chapter III- Section 3(D) and (E)) to suspend activities, and/or revoke event sanctions until safety items are shown to be corrected.
 - 2. Second infraction: loss of all race sanctions for the club for 12 months from the date of second infraction.
 - 3. Third infraction: loss of club membership with a letter to the lake site owner informing them that the club is no longer covered by insurance. while also listing the reason why

CHAPTER III - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 3 - DISTRICT DIRECTORS

- A. They shall have a working knowledge of all clubs in their district.
- B. They shall have a personal knowledge of all secretaries of the clubs in their district.
- C. They shall act as a coordinator of all activities in their district.
- D. They shall have the power to suspend activities, or revoke sanctions within their district for safety issues, until the situation is rectified. at a contest for violations of safety violations and may reinstate it when the situation is rectified, within their district.
- E. They shall submit a complete report in writing to the President on all such threatened or actual action taken at a contest. The Director and President may develop a written plan of action for the club to follow to correct unresolved safety issues/practices.



Summary

IMPBA membership dues include commercial general liability and property damage insurance which protects individual members, registered clubs, municipal & state park boards, and private landowners from suits by third parties who may be injured by model power boats that are operated on IMPBA insured bodies of water for which member clubs have submitted the correct application (on a Club Registration and Insurance Application form), and have been issued an insurance certificate. Since rates or coverages may vary from time to time, up to date insurance information may be obtained from the IMPBA office.

Membership Coverage

All members in good standing will be covered at "sponsored, scheduled, and supervised activities." This means the coverage is good at sanctioned and club races, and open water practice sessions as long as you are following the safety procedures outlined through the IMPBA, and such events take place on an IMPBA insured body of water only. IMPBA's policy is considered a primary policy and would cover the costs of property damages or injuries to third parties caused by IMPBA event participants that may occur on an IMPBA insured body of water. It would also cover the cost of your legal defense and settlement or award should you be successfully sued - up to the policy limits. A deductible applies per claim. For current coverage and deductible information contact the IMPBA office.

Non-Member Coverage

The insurance does not cover any person who is not a paid member of IMPBA regardless of what other club or organization he may belong to. Paid members of other boating organizations may pay a single-event fee of \$15 for membership dues **during that event only.** The single-event application and payment must be completed online and can be found at www.IMPBA.net.

Therefore, no person may operate or assist in the operation of a model power boat, or enter the pit area, or operate a retrieve boat at any IMPBA sanctioned event on an IMPBA insured pond, and be covered by this insurance, unless he is a paid member of IMPBA.

Insured Sites

- No club may apply for insurance for a body of water presently or previously insured by another IMPBA Registered Club without the permission of that club.
- All Clubs applying for insurance on a body of water should submit a club application and a signed letter from the pond owner, on letterhead, giving their authorization for your particular club to conduct Model R/C Boat activities at that particular site.
- Permanent and temporary structures, such as drivers' stands/scaffolding or bleachers, are not covered by IMPBA insurance.

Safety

- It is not the intent of IMPBA to issue insurance to any organization that does not comply with and foster IMPBA Safety Rules and Regulations
- Adequate provision shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.
- "NO SWIMMING" signs should be posted in conspicuous places on all sides of the pond.

REMEMBER: SAFE BOATING IS NO ACCIDENT!


Fellow racers: It has been brought to my attention that more and more boats are arriving at the pond without sufficient flotation to stay up when they have died on the water. In our rule book it states:

SECTION F - GENERAL RULES OF COMPETITION II - REQUIREMENTS FOR MODEL POWER BOATS

A. The boat shall have positive buoyancy when open compartments are filled with water.

Each type of hull has its own issues. I have seen several FE hulls with NO floatation. When asked why, the reply is always, "It's all taped up". That's a good answer until you make a blistering pass, blow it off and it strips the cowl off the hull. Riggers sit very low in the water when dead. A Jersey Skiff will hold 24# (yes, pounds) of water when swamped.

Today's trends are for bigger boats that can weigh up to 30#. This means that the single noodle you used to use will not keep this new bigger, heavier boat afloat when it sits dead in the water.



Just lifting a large boat is a workout on the backs of those who volunteer to do the tough job of bringing your boat back to you. A gallon of water weights 8.34 pounds. A hull that has the ability to hold 3 gallons of water can weigh <u>an additional 25 pounds</u>. Remember, the larger boats can already weigh close to 30 pounds. Try lifting 55 pounds while reaching over the side of a rocking retrieve boat.

Be kind to the retrieve boat crews. Keep that boat afloat so they can more easily bring it back in!

Another trend is to mount water proof servos at the point they are needed and put the receiver and battery in a small box. This again has reduced your positive buoyancy when swamped.

Another negative to a hull without sufficient floatation — it sits low in the water. The CD's calls your boat dead but the other racers can't find it and run you over.

Here is a scenario that is happening all too often: You go blasting off into turn one after the start, and you get washed down and die. You're sitting in lane 2, and every time a boat passes you, they put more water into your hull. By lap 3, your boat looks like it's sinking and you are asking the CD to halt the race and retrieve your boat.

That isn't going to happen, and then you're not happy because you're dead and think you're about to lose your boat! In the summer pool noodles are readily available, they don't weigh much, are great insurance you're going to get your hull back when it has been sitting on the water through a heat, and not that expensive compared to the cost of your boat! ◆



CAN-AM Coming Up!

Here we are in the middle of summer up in District One land. It might be hot, but is sure beats having snow and freezing temperatures. Not a lot to report within our district. Our membership numbers are steady compared with years past, which indicates that our model boating community is strong and well.

The Northern Lights Model Boat Club from the Toronto Canada area is still the dominant club for members numbers. They have approximately 44 members and were formed in 2002. The Southern Tier New York RC Club also has a solid group of boaters and have recently acquired a new pond around Elmira, NY. I've seen photos of this new location and it looks fantastic. For 2024 they are hosting club fun runs and we hope for next year they will start hosting 2-day sanctioned races. Fingers crossed.



That change was on engine displacement, since everything had gotten a little bigger over the years. I am currently the Scale Director for District 5 for the past few years and have been promoting this class across the country ever since.

In Memory

William F. Lewandowski November 9, 1933 - March 4, 2024

We are sad to report that we have lost a long-time D6 boater. Bill Lewandowski, age 90, of South St. Paul, MN, joined the Twin Cities Model Boat Club around 1970, and raced in the '70s before his eyesight was inured. Years later he was able to participate in SAW speed attempts, and was our "Fastest Man on Water" winner several times. Bill was a machinist



REMEMBER: SAFE BOATING IS NO ACCIDENT!

It's up to all of us to stay safe, so if you see something... say something!

GENERAL

All IMPBA members and /or contestants are responsible to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the concept of good sportsmanship: to wit, a person who plays fair and conducts him/herself in an acceptable fashion while participating in IMPBA events.

The use of alcohol or illegal substance and/or abuse of prescription drugs while participating in an IMPBA race or sanctioned event is considered unacceptable conduct and is a Code of Conduct violation.

IMPBA reserves the right to deny membership to any individual who has, at any time, demonstrated unsafe boating practices, been suspended, or banned from another boating organization for any amount of time, or for any reason.

Adequate provisions shall be made for the safety of the contestants and spectators.

Club Safety Officers should inspect the pond area prior to Open Water, or start of events to ensure IMPBA rules are in effect and adequate protections are in place. A first-aid kit should be maintained by the officer.

Boats not considered safe may be denied running privileges. Additionally, boats that show erratic behavior indicating possible control problems may be ordered off the course and given points for "Did Not Finish." The driver must demonstrate the problem has been repaired before he/she may continue in the next heat.

Frequency flags/tags and impound procedures will be used on transmitters. A radio may only be turned on when the correct frequency flag/tag is available. 2.4 Ghz frequency transmitters are exempt from these rules.

SITE SAFETY

"NO SWIMMING" signs MUST be posted on all sides of pond.

No person shall be permitted in the water without express permission of the Contest Director.

No model boats may run while the retrieve boat is working or any full-size boat is in operation.

Persons under 16 must wear U.S.C.G. approved personal flotation device while operating the retrieve boat. PFD should be available for each person in the boat.

Safety Netting should be placed on all sides of the pond exposed directly to spectators and contestants. Any area not covered by netting MUST be kept free of all people and animals during the event using signs, ropes, or barriers.

Caution tape, signs, barriers, fencing and/or netting shall be used to keep spectators out of the water and a minimum of 25 feet from the shoreline, and signs posted: "No Spectators Beyond This Point"

Race officials, contestants, and assistants (PAID IMPBA only) are the only persons allowed in the restricted pit/engine test area (Neon safety wristbands should be issued to all to easily identify).

An effort should be made to protect boaters in the pit area by using netting, or a raised launch area.

Tent & canopy, or similar, must have in-ground anchor.

Fire extinguishers MUST be in the pit/engine test area.

No smoking in pit/engine test area.

Host club should provide depository for disposal of racers' contaminated fuel

Drivers stands/steps should have reasonably slip-resistant surface and hand-rails on all sides.

SAFE OPERATION

Whenever running a boat, whether during a race or practicing, there must be a spotter for each driver to watch for unsafe conditions.

When in the pit/engine test/launch areas shoes MUST be worn. Sandals or open-toe shoes are NOT acceptable.

Boaters should test their radio operation before starting an engine.

Always WALK TO THE LAUNCH SITE.

Once a boat passes the entrance buoy, there will be NO RE-LAUNCH.

Never bring a boat to the pit area straight in — ALWAYS RUN PARALLEL TO SHORE while slowing it down.

This review is NOT an all inclusive list of Safety Rules. Additional rules apply.

. When Is a Race Sanction Needed?

As a general guideline, your club should send in a sanction form for any event which you intend to advertise and invite persons outside of your club. This includes other IMPBA members and other recognized organization members such as NAMBA. This also allows you to accept the Single-Event Fee from a NAMBA member to enable him/her to race and be covered by IMPBA general liability insurance. Also any special exhibition races that you expect to be covered by IMPBA insurance need to be sanctioned as the site for the event must meet IMPBA safety criteria to be covered under our policy. A club race just for your club members does not require a sanction. Only sanctioned events & flyers will be listed on the IMPBA website Races/Events tab and Master Schedule.

What Does a Sanction Mean?

A Sanction is the official authorization of an event. A Sanction tells prospective participants that your club and pond are insured and they are therefore protected as IMPBA members, and that you agree to abide by all IMPBA Rules and Regulations. Contest Directors running the event and the CD/Referee making the calls must have successfully completed the CD test and carry the CD designation on their card. Deviations from competition rules are allowed as long as they are clearly stated on the entry form or site. It ensures participants that the rules will be impartially enforced, and guarantees the results of the event will be recognized as official.

Q. Who Approves a Sanction?

The Director for the district in which the contest is being held is responsible for approving sanction requests. This allows the Director to coordinate events within the district to avoid overlap that would affect attendance at your event or an event elsewhere in the district. When you submit your form directly to the IMPBA office, if it is not already signed, the office will contact your Director to verify the dates were approved. If there is a conflict, your director will contact you to work with your club on a solution or alternate date.

How Many Times Can a Single-Event Fee Be Paid By Non-IMPBA Members?

Multiple times. IMPBA allows persons who have a <u>paid membership to other boating</u> <u>organizations</u> to pay a fee so that they are included as a covered party under our General Liability insurance. They may pay this fee as many times per year as they wish. The \$15 fee allows running in <u>that event only</u>. The other organization member must pay a separate \$15 fee for each IMPBA sanctioned race he/she wishes to attend. The Single-Event status is not available in leu of a paid membership to a boating organization! To run on an IMPBA insured body of water you must be a paid IMPBA member, or a paid member of another organization who pays the Single-Event fee to run at an IMPBA sanctioned event. The Single-Event form and fee <u>MUST be completed online</u> (preferably at least on week prior to the event), clubs will not accept these fees at the race site.


